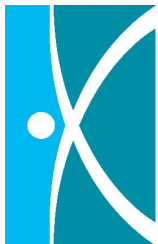

program description

Dr. Levit will present relational perspectives on psychotherapy with an emphasis on the evolution and expansion in our understanding of therapeutic process, therapeutic options, and therapeutic action. He will address relational revisions in basic concepts such as transference and countertransference. The foundations of relational perspectives will be presented, drawing upon the contributions of seminal theorists, such as Mitchell, Greenberg, Davies, Hoffman, Bromberg, Aron, Benjamin, etc. Dr. Levit will not only discuss central ideas about psychotherapy within the relational paradigm, but also examine them in light of more traditional psychodynamic perspectives. For example, the relational emphasis on the therapist's expressive participation will be considered in light of a more traditional emphasis on analytic restraint. Extensive case material, including process notes from sessions in therapy and psychoanalysis, will be shared in order to both examine theoretical controversies and illustrate relational therapeutic style and sensibilities, especially in encountering our more challenging clinical moments and circumstances.
