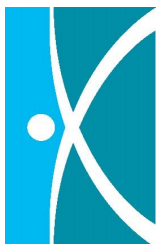
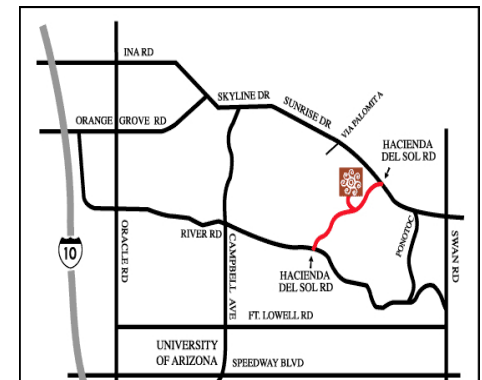
program description

Dissociation has become a central topic of study and enquiry in psychoanalytic clinical theory, usually in relation to the clinical effects of trauma. In this program, the specific mechanism of body-mind dissociation will be defined, its occurrence in everyday life illustrated, and its clinical manifestations explored. Normal transient dissociative states will be differentiated from fixed pathological types of dissociative personality structure. This will provide an opportunity to consider and survey the spectrum of dissociative conditions, ranging from well-organized "successful" false-self personalities to more disorganized post-traumatic personalities. Clinical approaches to dissociation and dissociated personalities will be discussed.

location and directions

From Phoenix, take I-10 East to the Orange Grove exit. Turn left (East). Continue to Skyline (traveling East). Turn Right.
